Dear Colleague:

NCCI is providing you with an advance copy of a white paper that presents a framework to evaluate the impact of various exposure and compensability actions on expected COVID-19 workers compensation losses. This paper demonstrates the variability of assumptions (e.g., infection rates, hospitalization rates, compensability rates, death rates, etc.) and enables the production of range estimates of the overall impact on losses. It allows individual state scenarios, as well as aggregating these impacts across multiple states. This is a unique and comprehensive instrument that will significantly aid the industry and inform decision makers such as yourself.
